

Position Title *Destination Imagination Challenge Master*

Position Description (Summary) Are you a team leader. Do you like to solve problems in a collaborative way? Are you able to fit individual personalities, strengths, interests and talents to meet program needs? This position is for those who are passionate about the philosophy of Destination Imagination and want to help students develop and use their imaginations to improve our world?

Position Description

A *Destination Imagination Challenge Master* will coordinate a team of adults to oversee the assigned Challenge site(s) at a Destination Imagination Tournament. The Challenge Master is also the contact for all appraisers for his/her assigned Challenge. The Challenge Master must understand the various appraiser roles and assign individuals to roles that best fit their interests and abilities. The Challenge Master will be the Affiliate expert in his/her assigned challenge. This individual must be a good team leader.. A DI Challenge Master must enjoy working with children and young adults in addition to being comfortable working as part of a team.

Primary Duties

- Review latest Rules of the Road and Challenge Master training documents for current tournament year
- Thoroughly understand the rules of the program, assigned Challenge, and applicable clarifications
- Read and participate in your Challenge specific forum
- Review tournament requirements, set up, and scheduling needs with Tournament, Regional, and Affiliate Directors
- Train volunteers assigned to appraise designated Challenge
- Instant Challenge Only -Review and select Instant Challenges for Tournament and procure and organize challenge specific materials for Tournament
- Central and Instant Challenge Masters - Work directly with the Tournament Score master for common understanding of scoring requirements
- Review Affiliate registered appraisers to determine Tournament assignments
- Set-Up and Organize Challenge Site(s) for Tournament
- Participate in any Challenge related DIalog discussion meetings
- Be able to present scores to Team Managers and Team Representatives
- Be able to fill the role of a scoring appraiser if needed

- Likes working with others to make sure they have a successful event
